Hope at the Center of Our Mission

St. John Center is a place where people experiencing homelessness seek help, find hope, and move home. Volunteers, staff, and visitors find hope here every day, in all sorts of ways.

"Hope is both in the individual and the collective. When a person who is in search of an opportunity is met by a community that embraces and prioritizes the humanity of that individual, there is hope," said James Alexander, SJC housing case manager. "From what I can see, St. John Center is an organization that consciously strives to cultivate and promote such a dynamic to the benefit of both the individual and the greater community."

St. John Center volunteer Heather Fox finds hope in her fellow volunteers and in the kindness the men show each other. "One of the first shifts I worked someone had a medical emergency and the first person to help was another one of the guys. He stayed with him until emergency services arrived," she said. "I find hope in the determination of a young man who asked for help finding opportunities to learn computer coding. I find

hope when I talk to other volunteers who agree that there is something special about St. John (Center), a sense of mutual respect and kindness that I don't always see outside these walls."

Nick, a SJC client, says the shelter staff give him hope. "The shelter offers excellent services and resources, but they are not as good as the people that work there. The staff is committed to helping individuals like myself get their lives back on track," he said. "They make me feel like they are pulling for me, like they have confidence in me, and that really makes me want to do better. I don't want to disappoint them. I want to be the guy that helps the next person do better."
