# A SILVER LINING

Since the on-set of the global pandemic, a lot has changed at St. John Center. While some change has been difficult and unsettling, one big change has emerged as a silver lining. In the last six months, 33 men have moved into housing. That good news is the result of Louisville Metro Housing Authority making Disaster Relief Housing available to elderly and disabled people experiencing homelessness because they are more at risk for COVID-19 without safe and affordable housing.

"A lot of these guys have been struggling and stuck in homelessness for a long time," says SJC Housing Counselor, Tom Parmenter. "It took one administrative change and suddenly we're moving people off the streets. It's really amazing."

Chuck and Herman met in April. With no place to be healthy at home, they camped outside, pitching their tents next to each other. Chuck is currently being treated for cancer and Herman has COPD. Those chronic health conditions make COVID-19 a serious threat. A SJC Outreach worker connected them to the Day Shelter, where Tom helped them both apply for the LMHA Disaster Relief Housing opportunity.

Within a week of completing the application, Chuck moved in to his own apartment. Herman moved in to his own apartment three weeks later. They see each other every day. When Chuck was in the hospital recently for surgery, Herman was there to support him.

"We really need people to know how much St. John Center helped us out," says Chuck. "Now, our lives can just be normal. We can be healthier."
