

### **RECOGNIZING 35 YEARS**



In 1984, a gentleman died of exposure on the streets of Louisville. Downtown churches and businesses noticed an alarming uptick in the number of people sleeping on their doorsteps overnight and a dramatic rise in the requests for assistance for the basics like food and clothing. The entire country was witnessing an increase in homelessness, and Louisville was no exception.

St. John Center was created to provide a place of refuge for people experiencing homelessness. On April 14th, 35 years later, we continue to respond to the unabated crisis of homelessness and the persistent lack of safe, affordable, and supportive housing services in our community.

In light of the prohibitions on large gatherings resulting from the pandemic, we plan a 12-month recognition of 35 years of service. You are invited to join us in recognizing the history of St. John Center, while envisioning a future without homelessness.

I imagine the excitement of opening day, April 14, 1986, when a few staff and a large crew of volunteers opened the doors and exclaimed, "Welcome! Come on in!" No matter your appearance, no matter where you've been, you are here now. Welcome.

I remember Sharon Whetstone describing the value of being a welcoming space. She said, "Just like at home when we're having guests, we ready the space so It's clean and tidy. We greet our guests at the door and call them by name.

We show basic hospitality." We offer hospitality in the midst of a hostile world, or as Sister Carol described it, "St. John Center is the soft heart of the city."

On March 18, 2021, the headline of an article in the New York Times reads, "Homelessness in the U.S. Rose for 4th Straight Year,

Report Says." We have a lot of work to do as a country. Until our services are no longer needed, St. John Center will open the shelter doors each day and say, Welcome.
